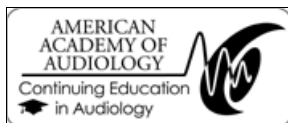

Dave Fabry, PhD

Dr. Fabry holds a PhD in Audiology from the University of Minnesota. His professional experience includes positions as a research audiologist at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Chief of Audiology at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN, and Vice President of Professional Relations and Education for Phonak Hearing Systems. Most recently, he was Chief of Audiology at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine.

Dr. Fabry has also served as an Associate Editor for *Ear and Hearing*, Editor of *American Journal of Audiology*, Associate Editor for Audiology Online, and Editor of *Audiology Today*. He has published over 50 articles in peer-reviewed journals. Dr. Fabry has presented widely in the U.S. and internationally and has served as a board member and president of the American Academy of Audiology, from which he received the Distinguished Service Award in 2009.

Gloria Garner, Chair AAA Ethical Practices

Dr. Garner completed her undergraduate and graduate degrees in audiology in 2003 at the Pennsylvania College of Optometry's School of Audiology. She has served on the adjunct faculty for the George S. Osborne School of Audiology at Salus University since 2004 and teaches online courses in ethics and aural rehabilitation. She has served as Chair of the Ethical Practices Committee of the American Academy of Audiology since 2007 and also serves on the Review and Editorial Boards of *Audiology Online* and *Healthy Hearing*. She is frequently invited to national and state meetings to speak on ethics in audiology.

She currently practices audiology in Augusta at the Medical College of Georgia's University Speech and Hearing Clinic.
